

# Porirua City Wellbeing Advisory Group Information Sheet

## What is the purpose?

To establish an expert, informed and enthusiastic advisory group for the Porirua City Wellbeing Report 2007

## What is the City Wellbeing Report?

The City Wellbeing Report is a report on progress made in achieving the City's Community Outcomes as set out in the Council's Long Term Council and Community Plan (LTCCP). The report will be published in June 2007.

## What is the value of having the City Wellbeing Report?

The City Wellbeing Report:

- helps us to answer the question "*how are we doing as a City?*"
- helps us to show progress made by the community in achieving Community Outcomes
- provides a baseline for monitoring City progress over time
- informs and assists Council and the community identify areas for possible further action
- will be used by Council and external agencies to inform business planning, funding bids, contracts, status reports, services, City and agency promotion etc for a range of issues
- will cover a broad range of issues but will have a clear set of 'highlights' – priority issues considered to be of special interest to Porirua

## What information will it contain?

The City Wellbeing Report 2007 will mainly report on progress made on the Community Outcomes in the 2004-2014 LTCCP. However, there will be a practical eye to the future, because the LTCCP 2006-16 includes a similar set of Community Outcomes and measures.

## How will we do this?

We will aim to use a simple, consistent approach to information collection, common measures and datasets.

## What is your role?

We would like your input on the City Wellbeing Report 2007 format, content, measures, local knowledge, trends, and descriptive statements.

## What level of involvement is likely to be required?

You will be part of an Advisory Group of 10-12 people to contribute to the issues spanning the four aspects of wellbeing (environmental, social, economic, cultural). The time involved is expected to be attendance at a couple of meetings with most of the communications by email. We recognise that not everyone will be able or interested to be a member of the Advisory Group, so we are also consulting a wider stakeholder group. These include Councillors, Government agencies, Ngati Toa, community and business groups.
